WHY YOU SHOULD CARE ABOUT PLANNED GIVING

Big Data for the Great Wealth Transfer -

- \$68 trillion dollar wealth transfer is starting to happen now from Baby Boomers to Gen X & Millennials
- Bank of America found that 64% of wealthy individuals have not talked about how they plan to pass on their assets
- Baby boomers are 1/3 of the US population and give almost 50% of charitable giving.
- → There are 22 million more millennials than Baby Boomers.




WHY YOU SHOULD CARE ABOUT PLANNED GIVING

Big Data on the Church -

- Your Top Givers make up less than 25% of your giving population but provide funding for over 60% of your annual budget
- → Gen X givers only account for 20% of giving
- Millennial givers only account for 11% of giving





WHY YOU SHOULD CARE ABOUT PLANNED GIVING

What the Bible Says About Planned Giving



- ➤ Who made the first planned gift in the Bible?
 - √ David 1 Chronicles 22 & 28: Solomon built the temple but David acquired the wealth for it and left a legacy gift.

WHAT IS PLANNED GIVING

Definition -

Planned Giving is also referred to as gift planning or legacy giving. It enables the giver to make larger gifts to your church today and for the future.





WHAT IS PLANNED GIVING

1. Stewardship

- a. Genesis 1:1 & 28
- b. Psalm 24:1

2. A Part of Stewardship Ministry

- a. Funding the local church
- b. Creating more opportunities for ministry to share the Gospel



WHAT IS PLANNED GIVING

What Type of Ministry Handles Planned Giving?

- Generosity ministry but really you need another staff member that handles Planned Giving exclusively.
- Financial volunteers & a church staff leader that directs
- Form a committee to promote planned giving



WHAT IS PLANNED GIVING

What Planned Giving Does for the Church

- If you're asking for cash only, you're missing out! You're asking from the small bucket.
- Sustainable long-term funding
- Tax savings for the giver
- A typical planned gift is 200-300 times larger than the size of a giver's largest annual gift





WHAT PLANNED GIVING IS NOT

- 1. Only an end of life strategy
- 2. Only a tool for Non Profits and Higher Education
- 3. Not as scary as it seems



WHAT PLANNED GIVING IS NOT

Who is Planned Giving for:

Age demographics of planned givers: 40 -70+ years old

✓ Any group receiving the wealth transfer inheritance from their aging relatives



HOW DOES PLANNED GIVING HELP

It helps the Giver:

- 1. Trade a Gift for Income / Transformational gift/legacy
- 2. Lower taxes for the giver

It helps the Church:

- 1. Receive a transformational gifts
- 2. Keep the doors open to continue reaching the least, the last, and the lost (the Great Commission)
